new Methodist International Church and Conference Building is definitely built on rock – solid granite with veins of quartz.

But of course we are not just erecting a building but creating a place of grace and hospitality, a sacred space. This raises the question: what sort of foundations are required for such a building? Here is my response:

Light to the World – The Advent candles at the headline of this issue remind us of the focus of our faith - Jesus , the light of the world, who we celebrate this Advent and Christmas. Jesus comes with grace and truth to shed light in a world of chaos, political division, social upheaval, racial antagonism, violence and war. It was a dark world then and it is a dark world now.

I have previously indicated that the redeveloped MIC building will be a beacon church. It will shine the light of Christ in the community, pointing to faith in Christ, nurturing people in discipleship, caring for the community and standing for justice. In that sense it will be a beacon in Hong Kong and beyond.

Streams of Grace – Another foundational concept relates to a key design feature of the Church with its shaped, flowing design. It captures the key Methodist belief that God's grace flows to all human kind. Streams of grace which embrace all people from many countries The Word of God – is honoured and preached. Creative communication and relevant preaching will be at the heart of the new MIC. Christianity is a religion of the book, the *biblio*, the Holy Bible. Part of the Methodist heritage has always been to search out how to make biblical teaching relevant to the issues of the community, something which will be honoured week by week.

The Cross is Central – to the design of the church and the heart of the faith. Shining into and from the building it is a stark reminder of God's saving grace for all humankind. It



shines also as a prophetic sign of that humble self-giving love which triumphs over selfish desire and sin.

Hospitality – and accessibility are key to the design, so we have two main kitchens and almost every floor has a pantry to provide refreshments and snacks for those who come for fellowship and meetings. Table fellowship was very important in the ministry of Jesus.


